
Lent is Here!



The ideal donation will enable a family to "make a meal," so items such as pasta and canned pasta sauce, canned tuna and/or chicken and/or beef, and Hamburger Helper items are great. Clients also like pancake mix and pancake syrup. Canned fruits or vegetables are great too. Personal care items are always welcome. Many people who don't use food stamps don't know that those on food stamps can't use that money for personal care items—only food.
